Foreword

Eastern Karbi Anglong College, a leading higher educational Institution of the eastern part of Karbi Anglong district, was established in 1997 at Sarihajan at the unstinting initiative and generous contribution of the local public. The noble attempt to establish this college was made in 1997 itself with the convening of a public meeting on 6th July 1997 at Sarihajan PWD Rest House under the presidentship of Mr. Humsing Bey, the then E.M. i/c Edn. KAAC, Diphu. It was in this meeting that a resolution was passed to start the Eastern Karbi Anglong College from the session 1997-98.

However, the regular classes started in September 1997 with Mr. B.B

Goswami (Retd. Lecturer, Deptt. of Economics, Kaliabar College) as the founder Principal. He was assisted by the founder Lecturers Mr. A.C. Das, Mr. S.L. Subba, Mr. E. Ekka, Mr. P.K. Saikia, Ms. K. Singh, and Ms. R. Singh. The college had a humble beginning with only 41 students.

As the college did not have its building, it was initially housed at the old dispensary building of Karbi Anglong Sewa Kendra and the newly erected temporary house by the local public at Sarihajan Tiniali. The KAAC, Diphu has generously allotted 100 Bighas of land to this budding institution. In 2001 the college was shifted to its beautiful permanent building at Talbalijan. It has been receiving the services of qualified, experienced, and dedicated lecturers.

It was formally inaugurated on 29th September 2003 by Dr. Jayanta Rongpi, the then M.P., and Mr. Jagatsing Ingti, M.L.A.

The College has acquired establishment and academic permissions from the Education Department of Karbi Anglong Autonomous Council, Diphu from the date of its inception in 1997. It has also obtained permission for classes up to Degree level from the academic authority of Assam University, Silchar in 1998. An affiliated institution under the Assam University, Silchar, the college was granted "Govt. Concurrence" by the Govt. of Assam in 18th October, 2001. More satisfyingly, the college has been accorded Degree Examination Centre in 2005 and since then it has been successfully conducting the TDC Examinations. The process of bringing this institution under the deficit grants-in-aid-system of the Govt. of Assam was started in 2002 and the Assam Venture Institutions Provincialization (of Services) Act, 2011, amended 2012 has

been enforced in the college w.e.f. 1st January 2013. Further, Eastern Karbi Anglong College, an affiliated (permanent) college under Assam University, Silchar, has been granted U.G.C.'s 2(f) & 12(b) status vide order No. F No.8-498/2012(CPP-I/C) dated 13th October 2015.

Since its establishment, the college has recorded quite satisfactory academic performance. Gradually the college has been on its way towards carving out a name and fame in various fields including games & sports and literary activities.

<u>A PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE</u>

The long-cherished dream of the people of eastern Karbi Anglong came to reality in 1997. It was through the pioneering effort of a group of cross-sectional visionary and sensitive minds like Late Jygya Ram Gogoi, Late Rajendra Rongpi, Mr. Humsing Bey, Mr. Hiramoni Sen, Late Janardan Pathak, Late Michel Lakra, Mr. Jivan Ch. Pathak, Mr. P.K. Das,

Mr. Kangther Bey, Mr. J.C. Rongpi, Mr. Borsing Terang, Mr. Atul Kalita, Mr. Langtuk Timung, Mr. Wophong Rongphar, Mr. Dorsing Rongpi, Mr. Kalamsing Bey, Mr. Hakim Rongpi, Mr. P.R. Mech, Mr. S. Kalita, Mr. Jonasing Phangcho and many others that the college came to its existence.

This venture Arts College was started with only 41 students and 6 teachers. A lot of concerted efforts are being made by its noble founders, the general public, the college authority, and the students' leaders in bringing the college under the deficit grants-in-aid system of the Govt. of Assam.

The college, located in the outskirts of Bokajan town at Talbalijan, has 12 (twelve) Departments, 39 Teachers, 14 Non-teaching staff, and more than 1000 students on the roll. As to the age of the college Library, it goes back to the year 1998 when it was started in its old building with 351 books while at present it has around 7000 books besides multifarious journals, magazines, and newspapers. The ideal location of the college provides a serene atmosphere with calm and green surroundings which are conducive to academic pursuits. It offers ample opportunities for students to develop their skills and talents through academic and co-curricular activities. The college News Letter has been brought out yearly since 2004.

Thus the doors of higher education for the general students of the eastern part of Karbi Anglong district have been opened and much progress has been made both in the academic as well as the infrastructural front.

Eastern Karbi Anglong College has been trying to open new courses at the college for the benefit of local students. From the session 2011-12 the college has opened a study center of **Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University** in the college for the benefit of those aspirants who have dropped out from general studies or those in service. Courses available are B.A. and M.A. Again, D.EL.ED. the course of two years duration is offered here under K.K. Handique State Open University for the benefit of the TET qualified school teachers.

It is quite heartening to note that the College has been granted the **Science Stream** by the Govt. of Assam vide order No. DHE/CE/Misc/ 113/ 2020/IS dated Kahilipara, the 3^{rd} August 2020. The college is well equipped with brilliant and professionally adept teaching faculties and an up-to-date Science Lab to cater to the teaching-learning needs of the students to be admitted into the Science Stream. Last but not the least, the college has been assessed by NAAC in the year 2022 and accredited with **B**⁺ **Grade** (2.58 CGPA) in its 1st cycle of assessment.

The Traditional Karbi Shawl reflects the age-old culture of the Karbi people.

Eligibility for Admission into First Year H.S. Course

For seeking admission to the first year Higher Secondary Course, a candidate must have passed H.S.L.C. Examination under SEBA/CBSE or any other equivalent examination under State/Central Boards recognized by the competent authorities. Admission into the HS course will be given as per the specified percentage of marks to be prescribed by the Admission Committee of the College.

Promotion Rules for H.S. 1st Year:

In promotion of Higher Secondary First Year students into Second Year class, Assam Higher Secondary Education Council's guidelines shall be followed. However, the decision of the H.S. First Year Examination Committee shall be final in matters relating to the Promotion Rules.

FOUR YEAR UNDER GRADUATE (FYUG) PROGRAMME

The college offers undergraduate degree programme in accordance with the NEP 2020 from this academic year (2023-24) under the academic management of Assam University. This undergraduate degree programme will be of either 3 or 4 year duration, with multiple entry and exit options with appropriate certifications such as:

- > A UG certificate after completing 1 year (2 semesters) of study,
- ➤ A UG diploma after 2 years (4 semesters) of study,
- ➢ 3-year Bachelor degree after a 3-year (6 semesters) programme of study,
- 4-year Bachelor degree after a 4 year (eight semesters) programme of study. This programme is of 2 categories, namely,
 - (i) 4-year Bachelor degree with Honours and
 - (ii) 4-year Bachelor degree with Honours and Research

To pursue 4-year undergraduate (FYUG) programme, the students should not have any arrear paper up to 3rd year (sixth semester).

(i) **4-year Bachelor degree with Honours** : This degree will be awarded after a 4 year (eight semesters) programme of study. **The students opting for this programme have**

to study three (03) additional discipline specific courses (DSC) in eight (08) semester.

(ii) 4-year Bachelor degree with Honours and Research: This degree will be awarded after a 4-year (eight semesters) programme of study. The students opting for this programme have to complete a rigorous research project/ dissertation in his/her core (major) area of study. Besides, to move to 4-year programme with Research and Honours, min. 7.5 CGPA should be obtained by a student upto 3rd year (sixth semester).

The departments Assamese, Economics, Chemistry, Zoology and Botany will offer this programme if the affiliating university i.e., Assam University recognizes the faculties of the departments as supervisors to supervise the research work of the students.

Note:

- Students who exit with a UG certificate or a UG diploma are permitted to re-enter within three years and complete the degree programme.
- Students may be permitted to take a break from the study during the period of study but the total duration for completing the programme shall not exceed 7 years.

Eligibility for Admission into First Semester under FYUG Programme

- Candidates seeking admission into the First Semester must have passed Higher Secondary (10+2) Final Examination under AHSEC or any equivalent examination conducted by a recognized Board/Council.
- Admission into the 3-year/4-year undergraduate programme will be given as per the specified percentage of marks to be prescribed by the Admission Committee of the College.

Note: Preference will be given to candidates of Assam state. However, wards of Businessman/employees serving in Assam will be considered as the candidate of the state.

- 1) Discipline Specific Core (DSC) Courses
- 2) Discipline Specific Minor (DSM) Courses
- 3) Interdisciplinary Courses (IDC)
- 4) Ability Enhancement Courses (Language) (AEC)
- 5) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)
- 6) Common Value Added Courses (VAC)

<u>Clustering of Subjects for opting</u> <u>Discipline Specific Core (DSC) and Discipline</u> <u>Specific Minor (DSM)</u>

- Same subject cannot be selected as DSC, DSM and IDC
- Both DSC and DSM should be selected from within either of clusters. That is, DSC from one cluster and DSM from other cluster is not allowed.
- > Opting one literature as DSC and other literature as DSM and IDC is not allowed
- DSC-451 course is research methodology and content of this course shall be same across the subjects and across the disciplines for the students opting for Degree with Honours and Research. However, for other students, DSC-451 is a usual 500 level paper.

Cluster -I

Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Economics

Cluster -II

Botany, Zoology, Chemistry, Mathematics,

Cluster -III

Political Science, History, Economics, Sociology, English, Assamese, Education, Mathematics

Selection of subjects from DSM

- > Students should take two subjects from DSM related to his/her discipline.
- DSM-101, DSM-201, DSM-251 and DSM-301 (comprising of 13 credits) are the first minor subjects and DSM-151, DSM-252, DSM-302 and DSM-351 (comprising of 13 credits) are the second minor subjects in case of TYUG programme.

- DSM-401 is the first minor subject and DSM-451 is the second minor subject in the 4th year (VII and VIII semesters respectively) if the student opts for FYUG programme.
- Students cannot change the code of minor papers, viz.one student opting English as core course may have Sociology as first minor in DSM-101 and Economics as second minor in DSM-151; but, the other student opting English as core course may have Economics as first minor in DSM-101 and Sociology as second minor in DSM-151.

Change of Core Course

- Students securing CGPA above 6.0 and with no back paper shall be allowed to change his/ her core course once only, after completion of second semester.
- However, automatic change in the minor course should be done if a student desires to change one of his/her minor courses to core course.
- > Change of core course may be allowed only within allied subjects.

Bunching of Subjects for Interdisciplinary Courses (IDC) under FYUG Programme

- The college offers three (03) baskets of interdisciplinary courses (IDC). Students may opt for any one from these three baskets for I, II and III semester.
- Semesterwise change of IDC is not allowed.
- > Natural science in IDC shall not have any practical component.

Evaluation of AEC, SEC and VAC

There shall not be any internal examination for AEC courses. Full marks for AEC will be 50 with two hours exam, duration.

- For SEC for Science stream, full marks shall be 100. It will be divided as follows: 50 (End Semester Theory) + 30 (End Semester Practical/ Project/ Field Work) + 20 (Internal exam. out of which 14 for test and 6 for attendance).
- For SEC for Arts, full marks shall be 100. It will be divided as follows: 50 (End Semester Theory) + 20 (End Semester Practical/ Project/ Field Work) + 30 (Internal exam. out of which 20 for test and 10 for attendance).
- For VAC-151 (EVS), full marks shall be 100. It will be divided as follows: 70 (End Semester Exam.) +30 (Internal Exam/ Assignment)
- For VAC-101 (with practical), evaluation will be same as that of SEC (With practical) and that of VAC-101 (without practical) shall be same as VAC-151.

Evaluation of Reseach Project/ Dissertation

- Total marks for research project/ dissertation is 300 out of which 90 is internal exam. and 210 for end semester exam.
- The project shall have to be presented before Departmental Research Committee and in presence of an external examiner during end semester exam.
- Out of 90 marks for internal, there shall be three progress reviews. Each review carries 30 marks. Progress review shall be done by concerned supervisor in presence of Departmental Research Committee.

Evaluation of DSC, DSM and IDC

- Total marks for each course of DSC, DSM and IDC is 100 which will be divided as follows: 70 (End Semester Exam.) + 30 (Internal Exam. out of which 20 for written test and 10 for attendance)
- For subjects with practical DSM-251 shall be practical for first minor and DSM-351 shall be practical for second minor. Marks for practical exam. is 100.
- For subjects with practical, DSC-152, DSC-253, DSC-303, DSC-354 and DSC-404 shall be practical with 100 marks. Practical examination shall be held in presence of External Examiner.

Note:

Duration of End Semester Exam:

- 1) Theory paper: 3 hrs and Practical paper as per Syllabus.
- 2) AEC paper : 2 hrs

Admission into Higher Semester after ESE (End Semester Examination):

- Admission to immediate next higher semester (2nd/3rd/4th/5th/6th Semester) after End Semester Examination shall be mandatory for each and every student with or without "Arrear paper(s)". Such admission procedure shall start at the completion of ESE and shall be completed well before the commencement of classes for the respective semester.
- A student who fails to get admission in any higher semester for any valid reason may get admission in immediate next similar semester (Odd or Even).

Medium of Instructions

The medium of instructions shall be ENGLISH except Programmes/Courses/Subjects/Topics in Modern Indian Languages.

HOW TO APPLY FOR ADMISSION INTO HS AND FYUG PROGRAMME

1.HS Course

Students seeking admission into HS course of study will have to apply online through the DARPAN portal of Assam Higher Secondary Education Council selecting Eastern Karbi Anglong College as one option which can be accessed through the webpage: http://darpan.ahseconline.in/. After applying in DARPAN, the candidate must fill up and submit the ONLINE application of the college in the link to be available in the college website: www.ekac.in. The candidate will have to submit the Acknowledgement Receipt along with other documents in the college office. The college will notify admission dates along with list of selected candidates.

2. FYUG Programme

Students seeking admission into their respective course of study will have to apply in the online portal of Assam University, Silchar and upon completion of the process, they will have to download the Acknowledgement Receipt generated in the portal itself. The candidate will have to submit the Acknowledgement Receipt along with other documents in the college office. The college will notify admission dates along with list of selected candidates.

EXAMINATION RULES

i. College Examinations:

All the students must appear in the Terminal/ Test Examinations conducted by the college. No students shall be allowed to fill up the final examination form without passing the test examination. In case of illness, sick bed will be provided. Students who fail to appear the terminal/ test Examinations conducted by the college shall not be allowed to appear in the examinations conducted by AHSEC/ AU.

ii. AHSEC / AU EXAMINATIONS:

- a. Only those students who have passed the terminal / test Examinations conducted by the college can apply for final Examination.
- b. Students are required to attend at least 75% of the classes held in each subject failing which they shall be liable to a fine of Rs.50/- (Rupees fifty) only. Students failing to attend at least 50% of the classes held in each subject shall not be allowed to appear in the final examinations.

c. Students (except private) are required to attend the examinations in FULL UNIFORM. Defaulters of this rule shall be fined Rs. 500/- (Rupees five hundred) each time found guilty.

UNIFORM OF THE COLLEGE

All students shall attend the college in "FULL UNIFORM" as given below:

Male: White shirts, Steel gray pant and Navy blue sweater.

Female: White chauridar with light-green churni and Navy blue sweater. The Uniform shall be modest and decent; JEANS & EMBROIDERED garments in the prescribed colour of the Uniform shall in no way be tolerated. No Leggings shall be allowed.

<u>NOTE:</u> FULL UNIFORM IS COMPULSORY FOR ALL THE STUDENTS (BOTH REGULAR AND PRIVATE) DURING ALL OFFICIAL WORKS AS WELL AS EXAMINATION PERIOD.

STUDENT-SUPPORT FACILITIES

A. IDENTITY CARD

Each and every student shall be provided with an Identity Card and s/he shall carry it at the time of attending the classes. An Identity card issued is valid for a period of one year, i. e., one academic session. On expiry of the Identity Card, it has to be surrendered for renewal. The process of renewal has to be completed within one month of the new academic session.

B. LIBRARY:

The college library has a strength of over 7000 books besides journals, magazines and others periodicals. Every student is expected to avail library books for their academic and personality development.

LIBRARY RULES

Students are expected to observe the following rules of the library:

- 1. A student can borrow books form the library for a period of 15 days from the date of issue.
- 2. A fine of Re. 1/- per day will be imposed if a book is not returned within 15 days.
- Two library cards are issued to every student on payment of caution money of Rs. 100/- and they can borrow maximum two books against the cards.
- 4. The college library card holder students have to renew their cards by the Librarian to continue for the next consecutive years.
- 5. The caution money is refundable after their final examination on production of Caution money receipt along with library clearance certificates from the Librarian.
- 6. Students should carefully examine the book(s) issued to them before leaving the college library. If any damage in the book(s) issued to him/her is noticed, it should be reported to the Librarian before taking delivery of the same. The borrower will be responsible for loss or damage of any books borrowed from the library. He will be penalized with double the price of the book.
- 7. All books borrowed from the library shall have to be returned to the library 15 days before the commencement of the summer break.
- 8. If the library card is lost by any students, it should be reported to the Librarian immediately.
- 9. The authority reserves the right of framing any additional rules as may be necessary from time to time.

C. SCHOLARSHIP

Various scholarship schemes are available as per Govt. rules. Scholarship money is paid directly to the students by the government through Bank Accounts. Scholarship forms will be issued to the students of H.S. First Year & TDC 1st Semester only on production of Account Number of any Nationalized Bank having Core Banking facility. Scholarship facility is provided to the bonafide students of the college only.

D. HEALTHY PRACTICES

The college has devised certain healthy practices as follows:

a. Maintenance of neat and clean environment.

Every student should try to keep the college campus neat and clean as it leaves a strong positive bearing in the minds of those in and around it.

b. Improvement of academic environment.

All the students should try to maintain a cool, calm and gracious environment in the college for better academic pursuit.

c. Outreach Programmes

The college authority always encourages outreach programmes such as medical camp, literacy drive, plantation drive, AIDS control, community service and like.

d. More contact hours in an academic year.

The college authority emphasizes devoting more contact hours per paper in an academic session at undergraduate level.

e. Awards

The college has a provision of giving award to the students who shows his/her expertise in learning process. These are:

Best Graduate Award: i.A cash prize containing worth Rs.5000/- with certificate for the student who secures highest marks in Degree with Honours programme has been instituted by the college.

ii. A cash prize containing worth Rs.5000/- with certificate for the student who secures highest marks in Degree with Honours and Research programme has been instituted by the college.

Best Reader Award: A cash prize containing worth Rs.2500/- with certificate and a dictionary will be given to the best reader in college library. Best reader will be selected as per library record of reader.

Best E-resource User Award: A cash prize containing worth Rs.1000/- with certificate and book will be given to the best e-resource user in college library. Selection will be done as per library e-resource user statistics.

f.Felicitation: The College has a provision of felicitating the faculty who achieves any award or honourable and prestigious degree for the expertise in his/her academic journey. The awardee is felicitated in Freshers' Social Function of the college.

g.Fee Waiver Scheme: Fee Waiver Scheme is available to the BPL students hailing from the adopted village of the college. They will be exempted from paying the mandatory fee of Rs. 200/- at the time of admission.

h.Quality Advisory Committee (QAC)& Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

It shall be the duty of the Anti-ragging Committee to monitor and oversee the performance of the Anti-ragging Squad (to be nominated separately by the principal) in prevention of ragging in the institution. It shall be the duty of the Anti-ragging Squad to conduct an on-the-spot enquiry into any incident of ragging and the enquiry report along with

recommendations shall be submitted to the Anti-ragging Committee for action under clause (a) regulations 9.1.

On receipt of the recommendation of the Anti-ragging Squad or on receipt of any information concerning any reported incident of ragging the Head of the institution shall immediately determine if a case under the penal laws is made out and if so,...proceed to file a First Information Report (F.I.R.) within twenty four hours of receipt of such information or recommendation, with the police and local authorities.

Provided further that the institution shall also continue with its own inquiry initiated under clause-9 of these regulations and other measures without waiting for action on the part of the police / local authorities and such remedial action shall be initiated and completed immediately.

GENERAL RULES FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE AMONG STUDENTS:

- Students admitted to the college must abide by the rules and regulations prescribed by the college authority from time to time.
